3. Approve Meeting Minutes for May 21, 2026. The minutes are now located on our website: DCOKNORTH.COM. Marilyn Loutou motioned to approve and Phil Templeton 2nd. Passed Unanimously

4. Introduce Guest –

5. Treasurers Report: Kaye Bennett –

- a. There were \$341.00 in deposits, \$650.00 in withdrawals, with an ending balance of \$2,309.04 at the end of May

6. Patrol Captain Report- Ted Garrett

- a. There were 257 miles logged
- b. One dog was seen on a leash, and one was seen without a leash
- c. There were five incidents', one burglary of Business, two larcenies, one destruction of property, and one recovered stolen vehicle
- d. The next Patrol Blitz will be on Saturday, July 11th. Donuts and Coffee will be served. Ted will have maps.
- e. Ted reminded us to be careful on the Fourth of July.

7. Sign Beautification Committee: Troy Mize reported that Ted had mowed, used the weed eater, trimmer, and watered the plant beds. The sign area is looking very good.

8. Executive Committee Report: Lonnie Austin

- a. The newsletter was emailed to all members this month for the first time. Only two readers texted to say that they had found their number in the letter.
- b. We plan to print some newsletters and distribute them at City Hall and the Community Center
- c. We have magnets available and information about Watch benefits at the front table at our meeting.
- d. Lonnie suggested not having a Neighbors Night Out next year unless we have a big draw Event/Person(s) to bring people in.
- e. Lonnie would like for us to support the renovations to Epperly Drive and Rose Lane.
- f. A member stated that we might look at hosting an event at 15th and Sunnyslane for Activities at this time, there are not a lot of businesses there and plenty of parking.
- g. Scott Tatum, our Ward 4 councilman, has informed us that there would be only two signs about Pets being on leashes per Ward. We would have to share our two with Midway Village since we are in the same Ward, so we would only

have one. At this time, we will not be pursuing the Council to provide any more signs.

9. Open Forum for New Business:

a. Lonnie asked the membership how they felt like we could promote our town and our Watch.

b. Some of his ideas is to have people come to promote different things available to us in our area.

c. A member suggested having a Videographer highlight the different things the Watch does for our area.

e. Another idea was hosting an Appreciation dinner for the membership at Golden Corral which could cost as much as \$500.00

f. Walter Jacques suggested along with Midway Village have a clean up day along Sunnyslane at I-40 to clean up around the curbs, weed eat, pick up trash. It would be a one-day event and would have the area secure with cones set up to keep on coming traffic out of the clean up area.
